To rediscover Chicago's dramatic history, start here.



When first incorporated, Chicago was a swampy little town populated only by a few hundred people. Soon after, the historical *Chicago Tribune* (1849-1986) began chronicling the city's challenges, achievements, and evolution into one of America's finest cities.

The *Chicago Tribune* provided detailed accounts of the Great Fire of 1871, which killed hundreds, nearly destroyed the city, resulted in many reforms, and spurred new growth. In 1893 and 1909, the newspaper's special Chicago Jubilee issues described and celebrated the city's tremendous progress. It also reported on the Progressive Movement, followed the works of Nobel Peace Prize-winning social reformer Jane Addams, exposed the activities of mobsters like Al Capone, and reported on the city's machine politics. To incisively convey ideas, opinions, and emotions, the *Chicago Tribune* relied on Pulitzer Prize-winning John T. McCutcheon's editorial cartoons.

To trace the development of Chicago and the Midwest, and to study subjects as diverse as politics, architecture, social reform, and art, start here ... with the historical *Chicago Tribune*.

Searches can be confined to 20 specific article types and dates to focus on the most relevant information. Each newspaper page is zoned into article images, and each newspaper image is supported with searchable ASCII text. Combined, these features mean faster, more effective searches for users. ProQuest digitizes documents at a high resolution to deliver clean, readable images, and highlighted search terms focus readers on the most relevant content.

Researchers can sort their results by oldest, most recent, or most relevant. In addition, articles that originally spanned multiple pages of a newspaper are “threaded” together, appearing as one continuous image and improving readability. Users can view and easily download articles, front pages, photos, display ads, and more in PDF format. The “My Research” summary feature can be used to track recent searches, save articles, email documents, create a bibliography, export citations, and create Web pages.
